- Managed grants and contracts and provided technical assistance for four divisions, over 30 management staff, and 16 Native communities.
- Developed 225 reports annually for four years.
- Proven ability to research, compile, and analyze data.
- Collaborated with executive staff, project managers, and finance departments to develop grants, process grant awards and develop sub-recipient grants.
- Successfully reviewed federal government grants on Native issues for six years.
